Reminder: COPD Pathway Access Through SCOPE Now Available!



The NWT OHT recently soft launched the **COPD Community Care Pathway, now accessible through SCOPE**.

This initial phase focuses on providing primary care with a single point of access to key COPD services, supported by a SCOPE Nurse Navigator who can facilitate access to appropriate community-based supports.

Connecting Patients to COPD Care

Through the SCOPE Nurse Navigator, you can connect patients to a range of COPD-related services, including:

- Diagnostic services (Spirometry), including disease management education
- Pulmonary rehabilitation
- Respirology support
- Telehomecare
- Non-clinical supports (e.g., transportation, meal services)

Could this be your patient?

- Chronic cough?
- Regularly produce phlegm?
- Feel short of breath with routine activities?
- Wheeze with exertion or at night?
- Experience frequent or prolonged chest infections?

Early identification of COPD can help patients access supports sooner and better manage symptoms in the community.

Cybersecurity Alert: What Primary Care needs to know

Ontario Health has issued a cybersecurity advisory highlighting the growing risk of AI-enabled cyberattacks targeting healthcare. New AI tools allow attackers to move faster, appear more credible, and focus on stolen logins and impersonation, leaving less time to detect or stop incidents.



Why This Matters

Healthcare settings are especially vulnerable due to older clinical systems, medical devices, and multiple vendor connections. Attacks may look legitimate and spread quickly before disruption is noticed.

What to Watch For

- Convincing phishing emails or messages posing as leadership, IT, or vendors
- Urgent requests for access, credentials, or action
- Unusual system or account activity

What You Can Do

- Be vigilant with emails, texts, and calls
- Never share logins or use shared accounts
- Use multi-factor authentication where required
- Report suspicious activity immediately
- Follow organisational guidance on AI tool use

Cybersecurity is a shared responsibility. Staff awareness and safe access practices are critical to protecting patient information and continuity of care.
