Operational Direction on eReferral

Driving Better Referrals Across Ontario



Ontario Health continues to advance eReferral, a secure digital referral solution that replaces paper and fax-based referrals with an electronic process that helps improve communication between clinicians, supports referral tracking, reduces administrative burden, and enables more timely access to care for patients.

As part of this work, Ontario Health is developing provincial Standardized Referral Forms (SRFs) for eReferral. Since the start of this work, Ontario Health has launched **29 SRFs**, and **six more will be added by the end of October 2026**. SRFs are designed to make referrals easier, faster, and more consistent by standardizing the clinical information required for specialist referrals. For primary care providers, this means less administrative burden, reduced duplicate data entry, fewer returned referrals due to missing information, and improved use of EMR auto-population capabilities.

To help guide future development, Ontario Health is seeking feedback on **which clinical specialties should be prioritized for upcoming SRFs**. Providers are encouraged to complete the SRF – Future Phases survey **by July 17, 2026 and share it with colleagues and networks**. Your input will help shape the next phase of provincial eReferral enhancements.
